Selective Courses	<p>3 to 4 courses with course numbers of 223Uxxxx offered by the Department of Chemistry</p> <p>The total number of credits received from taking three required (223 Dxxxx) courses in the advanced chemistry and the selective (223 Uxxxx) courses should be at least 14(excluding the credits received from taking the courses like Literature on Chemistry I-IV (Ph.D.), Research Training, and Ph.D. Thesis)</p>
Additional Regulations	<p>※the Research Training course :</p> <p>1. This course has to be taken every semester unless the thesis oral defense is passed before the course drop-add deadline for the semester.</p> <p>2. At least four semesters of Research Training directed under the same professor are required.</p> <p>※the Literature on Chemistry course :</p>

1. Doctoral students should consecutively take the Literature on Chemistry course for a total of 4 semesters, starting from the first semester after entrance.

2. At least 15 written reports from attending Chemistry department lectures should be submitted each semester.

✂For students enrolled after 2018, they shall take a Qualifying Exam, which includes a written research proposal and its oral defense.
